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


Prepare your Workbench Leg Mark and Drill Pilot Holes

- 1. Measure 2½" from the base of your workbench leg and make a mark on the center of the leg.
- 2. Place the assembly mount plate onto the leg and align the bottom hole of the plate with the mark.
- 3. Make sure the plate is straight and mark the top side hole (4-3/4" from the base of the leg) on to the leg. Remove the plate.
- 4. Drill a 5/32" pilot hole at the two marked locations. Only drill into the leg about 1" deep. Do not drill all the way through.

Shop Tip

When drilling your holes, be sure to keep the drill at 90 degrees to the leg.





Assemble the Caster

- 1. Raise the foot pedal to the upward position
- 2. Insert the caster wheel threaded stud through hole on the caster plate
- 3. Place the lock washer on to the threaded stud of the caster.
- 4. Thread the nut on to the threaded stud of the caster
- 5. Secure the nut tightly with a wrench or ratcheting socket.

Mount the Foot Pedal Assembly

Mount with wood screws

- 1. Place the foot pedal assembly back on to the leg and alignt the holes on the plate with the drilled holes on the leg.
- 2. Secure the foot pedal assembly using the supplied wood screws.



Repeat Process for All 4 Legs

Once completed with the first leg, repeat this process for the remaining legs on your workbench.

Your Workbench is Now Mobile!

Now your ready to quickly and easily raise your workbench off the floor and move it as needed.











Workbench casters aren't just for workbenches... The workbench casters can be mounted to many different machines, cabinets or tables. Depending on where you

The workbench casters can be mounted to many different machines, cabinets or tables. Depending on where you mount the casters, you may need to use bolts with nuts instead of wood screws. Nuts and bolts not included.



CAUTION When using your workbench machinery, stands or shop cabinets, make sure the casters are dis-engaged and the machine, stand or cabinet is sitting flat on the floor.
